## Matthew 16:21

“From that time Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised up on the third day.”

## Matthew 20:18

“Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem; and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn Him to death, and will hand Him over to the Gentiles to mock and scourge and crucify Him, and on the third day He will be raised up.”

## Luke 9:51

“When the days were approaching for His ascension, He was determined to go to Jerusalem.”

## Mark 1:45

“But he went out and began to proclaim it freely and to spread the news around, to such an extent that Jesus could no longer publicly enter a city, but stayed out in unpopulated areas; and they were coming to Him from everywhere.”

## John 12:14-15

“And Jesus, finding a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written, ‘FEAR NOT, DAUGHTER OF ZION; BEHOLD, YOUR KING IS COMING, SEATED ON A DONKEY’S COLT.’”

## II Kings 9:1-3

“Now Elisha the prophet called one of the sons of the prophets and said to him, ‘Gird up your loins, and take this flask of oil in your hand and go to Ramoth-gilead. When you arrive there, search out Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi, and go in and bid him arise from among his brothers, and bring him to an inner room. Then take the flask of oil and pour it on his head and say, ‘Thus says the LORD, I have anointed you king over Israel. Then open the door and flee and do not wait.’”

## II Kings 9:11-13

“Now Jehu came out to the servants of his master, and one said to him, ‘Is all well? Why did this mad fellow come to you?’ And he said to him, ‘You know very well the man and his talk.’ They said, ‘It is a lie, tell us now.’ And he said, ‘Thus and thus he said to me, ‘Thus says the LORD, I have anointed you king over Israel. Then they hurried and each man took his garment and placed it under him on the bare steps, and blew the trumpet, saying, ‘Jehu is king!’”
